#### ***A reading from Matthew (5: 1-12a)***

Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them.

He said:

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.  
Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.  
Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.  
Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.  
Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.  
Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.  
Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.  
Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness,  
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.  
Blessed are you when people insult you,  
persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me.  
Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted

You are blessed when you stand up for other people and for what is right. You will feel proud that you are being your best self.

You are blessed when you forgive others, for you will find people will be more willing to forgive you too.

You are blessed when you stay true to what you believe in and who God created you to be. This will help you to see that you are made in the image and likeness of God.

You are blessed when you are a peacemaker for that means you are living the way of Jesus.

You are blessed when you stand up for your faith and your values because that means you are being your best self.

You are blessed when you continue to be kind, generous and compassionate even when people do not treat you kindly in turn. God knows that is really hard to do, but you should celebrate being the best person you can be for God loves you for the awesome person you are.
